The band in the documentary then entered the room, proudly playing "When the Saints Go Marching In."

We heard speakers that affirmed God's love for all, we heard the story of a young man who immigrated to the United States, and the terrifying experiences of hiding, and being separated from his family, all with the dream of escaping the crime and scarcity in his home country. We toured the city. We laughed. We took an airboat tour, we fed alligators, we grew closer to one another and to God with new eyes to see our neighbor. We give thanks for you, Saint John, and your relentless support for these youth and leaders during a pastoral transition and we give thanks for Kyle Gann and Katie Warner who accompanied the youth on this trip. Above all, we give thanks to God for this experience.




We will have the following:

Chandra has also implemented processes to improve the quality of resident care at Bethany. She wants to actively engage our sponsoring churches to make sure we are meeting the spiritual needs of our residents and supporting their churches. Chandra looks forward to meeting all of you and having you as engaged members/volunteers at Bethany.

The quarterly meeting of our Auxiliary was held on Monday, July 8 at the Heights. Seven churches were represented. Michael Thomas, activity director said that their spiritual needs are being met more than ever. The population has increased at the Home and the Heights. Chandra plans to add a lounge area just inside the Home. She presented a proposal for the furniture and the costs. The Auxiliary voted to give them \$5,000 for the project. Chandra has established a strong care team and has made great strides hiring BLHS employees which directly impacts the consistency of care provided. She is committed to running BLHS as a religious nursing home where residents' spiritual needs matter, and regular communications with sponsoring churches is a priority. 
