Sunday school -9:45am "It's the ECONOMY #@&*!!!" Perhaps you remember this (edited) slogan, a line from a presidential campaign long past. At the time, the line gained a considerable amount of traction; and still, even though that particular election is long past, the issue seems to be a perennial one. The "economy" continues to play a key role in most presidential campaigns, primarily because – for most people – it is so pertinent to our every-day lives.

Whether we know it or not, that word, "economy," is also quite pertinent to our faith and occurs a number of times in the Greek New Testament. The word, "ECONOMY," originates from a Greek word – actually two words joined together: "oikos," which means "house" (yes, as in Oikos yogurt, "House yogurt"!!!) and "nomia," which means "management". Thus, "oikonomia" is the plan for managing one's house and the "oikonomos" (usually a servant who does not own the house) is the person entrusted to oversee and direct the plan set forth by the one who does own the house.

If you have not figured out by now why that word, "economy," is so pertinent to our faith, the translation of that word will make it all clear. You see, "oikonomia" is normally translated as "STEWARDSHIP" (managing things that ultimately belong to God) and "oikonomos" is the "STEWARD," the one called to do the managing, namely, you and I. From the perspective of our faith, everything we have – our possessions (treasures), our time, our talents, even our very lives – ultimately belong to God, which makes us "STEWARDS" (oikonomoi), managing gifts that have been entrusted to us by God, using those gifts in accordance with God's plan (oikonomia) as we live out our faith. As one person quite perceptively defined "stewardship": It's what we do after baptism! The slogan is true: It truly IS the ECONOMY!!!!!! Stewardship is pertinent to our every-day lives.

"Called To Be Stewards" is the theme of our 2024 Fall Stewardship campaign at Saint John. For three subsequent weekends, we will hear sermons based on the following passages from the New Testament that pertain to stewardship:

- October 5-6 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

"Stewards of the Mysteries of God" (Hear the Word)

- October 12-13 Luke 12:35-44

"Who then is the Faithful and Wise Steward?" (Live the Word)

- October 19-20 1 Peter 4:7-11

"Good Stewards of God's Varied Grace" (Share the Word)

As in the past, members of the congregation will receive in the mail an "Estimate of Giving" card and asked, as stewards, to prayerfully consider how much to set aside for the ongoing ministry at Saint John in 2025. October 19-20 is the weekend planned for the ingathering of these "Estimate of Giving" cards. If you are not available to worship that weekend, you may mail your pledge or drop it by the office. As a fellow steward in God's Kingdom, I want to thank you for all the ways that you steward the gifts that God has entrusted to you. Together, our efforts make a big difference in our community and beyond.



Songs from this hymnal will be in the bulletin prefaced by the letters ACS with the hymn # following.


SAINT JOHN FOUNDATION GRANTS

Why Volunteering Matters

Bethany Lutheran Health Services (BLHS) offers many opportunities for volunteerism. From landscaping and grounds work to assisting with activities and one-on-ones with residents and tenants, serving as an auxiliary member, or joining a board overseeing BLHS operations or its Foundation, or serving as a Bethany delegate at your church, there is something for everyone.

Nancy Ruffcorn, a longstanding volunteer, shared that volunteering "is really a mindset of giving back to your community." She began volunteering at Bethany because her church, St. Timothy in Council Bluffs, was already committed to supporting BLHS as a sponsoring church. Nancy's personal connection came from her mother, who stayed in assisted living for years. This experience helped her understand the challenges of aging and the needs of residents firsthand. Nancy recommended starting in activities: "The best place to begin volunteering is through activities!" She fondly recalled a fellow volunteer who would come in just to refill bird feeders.

Gary Schultz has volunteered as the Chapel Assistant for over 30 years. He sets up and records services, allowing residents unable to leave their rooms to still participate in church. Every Sunday, he transports residents to and from the chapel and assists during services. "It's amazing how many people I've met through volunteering at Bethany... I think I've met someone from every room at Bethany Lutheran Home."

The BLHS Board and Foundation are also seeking new members beginning January 1, 2025. Both boards have distinct responsibilities but work together to oversee Bethany's operations and provide financial support. Other than being a member of a sponsoring congregation, prior board experience isn't required—just passion and a commitment to being actively involved on the board. John Swalwell, who recently joined the BLHS Board, said, "Serving on the board has been an enlightening experience. I've gained immense respect for what it takes to operate BLHS. I've met amazing people who've dedicated their careers to caring for our elders, and I believe BLHS is unique in offering not-for-profit, faithbased services to our community."

The BLHS Auxiliary plays an essential role in supporting residents year-round. Jan Stone, Auxiliary President, explained, "Many women in our sponsoring churches are automatically involved with Bethany, even if they aren't aware of it. Some help by baking pies or assisting with bingo, though not all attend meetings. It's always challenging to find volunteers willing to serve as officers, but we are always seeking more help with the auxiliary. We'd love to see more women step up and get involved." To learn more about your church's involvement with Bethany, reach out to your pastor.

Bethany delegates are asked to attend the annual meeting held in early January to learn about Bethany and its operations. They also vote on leaders for the BLHS board of directors. Being a delegate is a good way to learn about this important ministry without a major investment of time.

Angel Watts, Activities Director at Bethany Lutheran Home, and Michael Thomas, Activities Coordinator at Bethany Heights, agree: "Without our volunteers, many of our events and programs wouldn't be possible." "Our residents love hearing our volunteers' stories," Angel said. "For many of them, they can't do much on their own, so they really benefit from one-on-one time." Michael added, "We love having volunteer groups, especially school or youth groups. We mark it on the calendar for our tenants. It's great seeing kids ask questions and learn about the residents' history." Angel also noted, "Since COVID, it's been difficult to get residents out of their rooms—they tend to isolate. Volunteers provide the engagement and encouragement they need, even if it's just for a walk."

Chandra Gustafson the BLHS Administrator said "Our volunteers, along with our board and foundation members, make a real difference here at BLHS. Their time and effort give our residents a reason to smile, and it helps us carry out our mission of compassionate care. Whether it's helping with daily activities, sharing a conversation, or guiding our organization, they lift everyone's spirits. At the end of the day, they're all helping us create the caring community we strive to be."

If interested in joining a board or the Auxiliary board, please reach out to your pastor and let them know what you're interested in volunteering for. All three volunteer areas are looking for energized and active members!

If you're interested in volunteering, reach out to Angel Watts (watts@blhs.care or call 712-328-9500). We have a volunteer application where you can indicate areas you'd like to help. Volunteers assisting with activities or one-on-ones will receive brief training and a background check, while those helping with service projects just need to coordinate with Angel and Michael.


