Call Committee Update:

The Call Committee of Saint John has interviewed another candidate for the position of Senior Pastor. I am excited to inform you that, after numerous meetings with the candidate, the committee has voted to refer the name to the church council. Since then, the candidate has met with Scott Hartman (Treasurer), Kim Townsend (Council President), and myself to negotiate a compensation package that is in line with synod guidelines and agreeable to the candidate.

In accordance with our constitution, the next step in the call process required a vote by the church council to refer the candidate's nomination, along with the compensation package, to the congregation for its approval. In accordance with this process, various members of the Call Committee met with the council at its October meeting and, after considerable discussion, the council voted unanimously to refer the candidate's nomination and the compensation package to the congregation.

The final step in the call process involves you, the members of Saint John. A special congregational meeting has been scheduled for Saturday, November 9 at 5:00pm. At this meeting the congregation will vote to extend (or, not to extend) a letter of call to this pastor. Out of respect for this pastor and the congregation this pastor currently serves, the candidate's name will remain confidential until the "meet and greet" scheduled one half hour prior (at 4:30pm) to the congregational vote. Please plan to attend this final and exciting step in this call process.

As you may well know, the Call Committee has spent much time and effort in this call process. In the surveys that were conducted to identify what you wanted us to look for in our next pastor you asked for someone with strong preaching skills, good communication, someone that is authentic, affirming and available, someone that is interested in helping us build our youth program and someone that works with us but doesn't necessarily do things for us. This candidate presents as having many of these attributes as strengths and areas of expertise. Please come and meet our candidate on November 9 and prepare to vote.

Lastly, I want to express my gratitude to the Pastoral Call team for all their work. This has been a long and difficult process and they have stayed the course. I also want to thank you, members of Saint John, for your input and prayers during the last year.
